

Item 3: Strategy for Developing a Consensus Proposal [ACTION]

Developing a Consensus Measure

- **Step 1: Proposal made, seconded?**
- **Step 2:** Any questions/clarification needed?
- **Step 3:** Any "Friendly Amendments?"
 - Need two"seconds" to be considered
 - Committee vote (simply majority to adopt)

Step 4: Poll Steering Committee

(Remember, this is just a "poll" asking if we put Proposal up for a Vote.)

- Is there "sufficient support" to take a Vote?
- Is there "insufficient support" to take a Vote?

Step 5: Steering Committee Vote



The "Agreement Scale"

- 1. = Whole-hearted agreement ("I really like it!")
- 2. = Agreement—with a minor point of contention ("Not perfect, but it'll work.")
- 3. = Support with reservations ("I can live with it.")
- 4. = Abstain ("This issue isn't important to me.")
- 5. = More discussion needed ("I don't understand the issue(s) well enough yet.")
- **6. = Don't like, but will support** ("It's not great, but I don't want to hold up the group.")
- 7. = Serious disagreement ("I am not on board with this—don't count on me.")
- 8. = Veto ("I block this proposal.")



"To Vote or not to Vote, that is the question"

- 1. Motion to Poll, Seconded? If NO, why?
- 2. If YES, Poll group: Is there sufficient support to have a Vote?
 - Proceed to Vote IF: Poll shows "sufficient support" (Average < 4.0 or an insignificant number of "5, 6 or 7's")
 - Do not proceed to Vote IF: Poll shows "insufficient support" (Average > 4.0 or a significant number of "5, 6 or 7's")
 - Do not proceed to Vote IF Someone vetoes (each member gets 1 veto per proposal)
- 3. Repeat Polling until a Proposal has "sufficient support" for a Vote
- 4. Proposal must receive 70% approval to be adopted.

Item 4: Guiding Principles [ACTION]

Possible *Guiding Principles* (1 of 2)

Fix what matters most

(repair and maintain existing local streets & roads)

Keep people safe

(enhance lighting, road safety & safe routes to school)

- Get people where they need to go efficiently (improve connectivity, accessibility, and affordability to essential services & amenities)
- Improve transportation alternatives (invest in building & maintaining trails, bike paths and public transit options)



Possible *Guiding Principles* (2 of 2)

- Build strong, vibrant communities
 (add shade, trees and other features to combat heat & beautify transportation corridors)
- Leave no neighborhood behind
 (invest across our county to strengthen all communities)
- Foster innovation
 (make smart investments that keep our county competitive and connected—now & in the future)
- Ensure a fair and transparent use of tax dollars



Existing Neighborhood Roads

- Streets near homes, schools, and parks
- Arterials such as Shaw/Jensen Avenues
- Major roads such as Whitesbridge/Lassen/Golden State
- Alleys, bike lanes, sidewalks (repair & new)
- Street lights, signals, and other safety features



Suggested Sub-Categories (2 of 6)

Public Transportation

- Transit systems urban/rural
- Senior/veteran/youth Transportation
- Carshare/Vanpools
- Mobility Hubs
- Future transportation alternatives



Suggested Sub-Categories (3 of 6)

Active Transportation

- Bike and pedestrian trail maintenance & construction
- Accessibility improvements
- Safe Routes to Schools

Regional Connectivity

- Major road projects for safety improvements and congestion reduction
